

# STATEMENT BY THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE AU COMMISSION (SRCC) FOR SOMALIA AND HEAD OF AMISOM, AMBASSADOR MAMAN SIDIKOU ON THE OCCASION OF AFRICAN UNION DAY, HELD IN MOGADISHU, SOMALIA ON 25 MAY 2015
